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Educational and academic programme INTERNATIONAL LAW

(EUROPEAN LAW/EUROPEAN COMPETITION LAW)

TRAINING CYCLE OF THE "EUROPEAN LAW" SPECIALTY

LEGAL FRAMEWORK OF PUBLIC PROCUREMENT IN THE EUROPEAN UNION

The course deepens students' knowledge of the legal bases of public procurement, which is an important area of the EU internal market, as a large part of the EU's economic activity is directed towards meeting public needs. The mechanism of legal regulation of public procurement at EU and Member State level is highlighted. Particular attention is paid to the practice of implementation of EU law on public procurement in individual EU countries, as well as the state of adaptation of Ukrainian legislation to the provisions of EU law.

EU TRADE LAW

The objective of the course is to master students of the basic theoretical problems of the European Union trade law, the legal foundations of the activities of the European Union institutions in the field of trade and its legal basis, the right regulation of common commercial policy instruments, the features of legal regulation of trade in goods between the EU and Ukraine, to apply to obtain practical tasks related to the implementation of Ukraine's foreign policy course, strengthening its authority and positions in the world arena their professional activity.

EU MIGRATION LAW

The course is aimed at deepening theoretical and practical knowledge of European Union law. The course focuses on the theoretical and practical aspects of ensuring migration processes in the European Union. Particular attention is paid to the review and analysis of the Schengen acquis system by the European Union; visa and asylum policies in the EU.

EUROPEAN JUDICIARY

The course is aimed at deepening theoretical and practical knowledge of the activities of the European judicial institutions. The course envisages, in particular, the coverage of the basic principles of the functioning of the European Court of Justice and the European Court of Human Rights, their case-law and legal positions, analysis of judgements where the Ukrainian element is present.

EU PRIVATE LAW

The course deepens and expands the theoretical and practical knowledge of the European Union law. The focus is on the study of the legal mechanisms governing the relations between the various legal entities in the EU Member States.

THE VOLUME OF THE PROGRAMME

120 credits ECTS,

Certification of graduates of the Educational and academic programme "International Law" of the specialty 293 "International Law" is conducted in the form of a comprehensive qualification exam in international law, a qualification exam "Theory and Practice of Translation" and public defence of the qualification master's thesis and is completed by the issuance of a document of the established sample.

After successful completion of the Educational and academic programme "International Law" and passing the certification, students receive the Master's Degree in International Law, EP International Law, and, if they meet the requirements, may obtain a professional qualification as an International Lawyer, Junior Research Fellow (International Law) and a translator in a specific foreign language.

TRAINING CYCLE OF THE "EUROPEAN COMPETITION LAW" SPECIALTY

EU COMPETITION LAW (MAIN BASICS & PROCEDURES)

The discipline aims to determine the practical aspects of the European Commission studying the procedures for applying competition rules by the relevant institutions of Europe. The course is studied by students in English in order to develop practical skills in applying specific legal terminology. The practical aspects of the launch of investigations by the European Commission and its terms of reference are explored. In this context, the case studies are examining the practical aspects of the application of EU Regulation 1/2003 and the practical implications of the implementation of EU Directive 2019/1.

WORKSHOP ON THE CONCENTRATION CONTROL

The discipline aims to determine the role of structural changes in the market, which manifests itself in the form of mergers or reorganizations of enterprises and explores the distinctive features between acquisitions and mergers. Students learn the procedural aspects of the EU's concentration control. Using the comparative legal method, procedures for granting a concentration permit in accordance with Ukrainian law are outlined.

STATE AID LAW TO ECONOMIC OPERATORS

The discipline is devoted to the study of theoretical and practical aspects of state intervention in market processes. A comparative analysis of WTO mechanisms and legal regulation of state aid in the EU is conducted. Students learn about the state and tendencies of the development of the State Aid Institute in EU law, principles and features of the law enforcement practice of the EU institutions regarding the determination of incompatibility of state aid with the EU internal market.

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY LAW AND COMPETITION

The course aims to familiarize students with the basic principles, academic approached, definitions, legal categories and intellectual property institutions; the course also aims to familiarize students with the system of international protection of intellectual property as part of the World Intellectual Property Organization; particular attention is paid to the international cooperation of States on the protection of intellectual property within the WTO.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION OF LEGAL PROCEDURES IN EU AND UKRAINIAN COMPETITION LAW (CASE STUDIES)

The course aims to train the practical skills in applying knowledge of the fundamentals of EU and Ukrainian competition law. The discipline consists of a system of practical tasks that cover the issues of concerted action, conclusion of agreements, abuse of a dominant position, control of concentrations, monitoring of state aid. It analyses and examines both the decisions taken by the European Commission and the judgements of the European Court of Justice (and the AMCU's decisions and the case law of appealing against such decisions), as well as providing hypothetical case studies for practical application.
