The programme 'East European Studies' is aimed at introducing students to basic theoretical and practical aspects of the regional developments in Central and Eastern Europe, which requires comprehensive and interdisciplinary knowledge in the field of policymaking for the implementation of foreign policy strategies at the national and international levels, taking into account the risks and threats of the modern regional system of international relations.

Programme goals. By the end of the course students should have:

- an understanding of the new role of Eastern Europe in the post-bipolar system of international relations and the key debates that surround this issue;
- an ability to analyse main threats and challenges of regional development, correlation of the processes of globalisation and regionalisation in the international relations;
- advanced knowledge of the current regional integration processes and the role and place of Ukraine in them;

- an ability to evaluate the non-regional actors' influence on the situation in Eastern Europe (the USA, Russia, China);
- a solid comprehension of the role and contribution of the EU into the regional agenda (such initiatives as European Neighbourhood Policy and Eastern Partnership);
- profound knowledge of sub-regional organisations and the level of political and economic cooperation between Central and Eastern European states.
